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AGENDA ITEM	Time	Discussion: After reviewing the letter, Carol Scherbak offered comments. Ms. Scherbak indicated that she was also on the committee to review the regulations at the time, which eventually were passed into law in 2007. During the review process, the Cabinet had concerns about certain programs and wanted to make the requirement for all programs to be JRC accredited. The requirement for programmatic accreditation was in the 2007 regulation and when the board was formed, the regulations were not changed, they were recodified. In 2015, when the regulations were revised by the board, the revisions were to clean up the language of the preexisting regulations. Ms. Scherbak voiced that her concern comes from the fact that as far back as 2005 there were discussions that the JRC accreditation standard would be added into the regulations. The program and the cabinet knew in advance that these regulations would be forthcoming, and yet the program did not maintain accreditation. Ms. Scherbak noted that there are citizens of Kentucky that in good faith went through the program and were given a license by the cabinet. Something that occurred in the past cannot be changed; however, in the regulations committee report a potential resolution to this issue will be proposed.
